






What Summer Means To Me

s a person who was born, raised and Llived Nova Scotia for six decades I think its safe to say, for many of us, Summer, has become synonymous with a sense of freedom; one that cannot be described in words but must be experienced with enthusiasm to be understood.

Summer is the perfect time of the year to naturally or organically connect to the people, places and things that support our wellbeing. When I say naturally I mean inherent to the types of activities we do in warmer weather. For example, laying, sitting, or walking on the Earth, or simply, playing barefoot will 'ground' our electro-magnetic bodies (electro: our nervous systems are electrical, whereas our thoughts, words and emotions are magnetic hence electromagnetic) to the Earth.

The support to our wellbeing comes in the "Grounding" which neutralizes the free radicals in our bodies. Free radicals are present when there is inflammation, stress, cell damage, and trauma in our bodies. Grounding helps to improve sleep, reduce inflammation and support our immune system.

Summer can mean spending more time in Nature or outside in general. This also means an increase in sun exposure (increase in vitamin D) and an increased awareness to

the sighs, sounds, smells and our responses to the world around us; as opposed to that of the larger World.

A walk in the woods has been shown to reduce blood pressure, boost short term memory, reduce cortisol (stress hormone) levels, decrease the symptoms of anxiety and depression and clear our minds for better focus.

Time spent at the beach reduces stress and release serotonin. The sights and sounds of the environment and its rythmatic nature are incredibly soothing and grounding naturally happens.

We also tend to hydrate our bodies more in the Summer than we might at other times of the year. The increase in fluids help with digestion, circulation, absorption, and transportation of nutrients, saliva production and keeping our body's temperature regulated. Another great benefit of being hydrated is in the support water (a conductor of electricity) gives to our nervous system (electrical current).

Summer often means more time socializing with others and enjoying delicious seasonal foods. Time spent with people we enjoy improves our psychological wellbeing, increases our cardiovascular health and can increase our sense of belonging. The benefits of eating, cooking or sharing a meal with others is in the trust that can be developed, the sense of community and in the reduction of isolation.

The enhancement of wellbeing happens more organically from late Spring to mid Fall in our climate. With a mindful approach the benefits can be experienced year round by getting outside and enjoying daylight, staying hydrated (your pee should be clear by mid day), grounding (take off your rubber soles), eating well, and spending more time with the people, places and things you can enjoy with all your senses!.

I want to take this opportunity to congratulate all high school graduates on successfully completing this chapter of your life! As a former teacher, it's always rewarding to see our youth finish another year with more knowledge and confidence than they had last September. Wishing all students, teachers, and staff, a safe and happy summer!!

Prospects are bright for our Youth!

As thoughts turn to graduates, we recall their future wasn't looking bright only a few years ago when the youth employment rate was the **lowest** it had ever been. Common concerns were lack of job opportunities, cost of financing their education, and barriers for young entrepreneurs. It all seemed insurmountable, with no "silver bullet" to fix the situation.

It took several initiatives working together to finally reverse that trend, and now more young people are staying to work here in Nova Scotia than are leaving! With over one-million jobs created since November 2015, the youth employment rate is now *higher* than it has ever been in our history!

That's a testament to many plans that were put in place, such as:

Small Business Investments:


Several measures were established, like cutting small business tax to 9% (lowest in the G7). New trade deals and our **CanExport Program** helped expansion into new markets, contributing to growth and job creation. For young entrepreneurs, we invested in **NEXT Canada** to offer mentoring, training, and seed funding of start-ups; and launched **Innovation Canada**, a one-stop-shop to help entrepreneurs turn their ideas into successful companies.

Helping students get a head start:

We also **lowered interest rates** on Canada Student Loans and Apprentice Loans, which are now interest-free for the first 6-months after graduating; and expanded the **Student Work Placement Program** to non-STEM students (e.g. arts, humanities, social sciences), creating more job opportunities.

Canada Summer Jobs:

The number of positions doubled this year, subsidizing more jobs for local businesses and giving

more youth practical experience. Also, since these were opened to all youth up to age 30 (not only students returning to school), they can potentially turn into long-term employment.

So, if you're concerned about our youth being able to make it, don't despair. The future is looking much better than it did a few years ago and getting brighter. Personally, I'm encouraged that my children and grandchildren now have better opportunities to make a good life here at home.

Nova Scotia Government Enhancing Supports for Students





s the MLA for Hammonds Plains-Lucasville, which contains three public schools, I know and witness daily that education is one of the most formative aspects of a child's life. As part of our new model of inclusive education in Nova Scotia, new resources are being introduced to continue to support our students.

Our fourth consecutive balanced budget has allowed for continued investments in inclusive education, with \$15 million being dedicated for resources and training supports for students with complex needs.

We're adding an additional 173 inclusive education specialists, teachers, and non-teaching staff to our schools this September, on top of the 190 we added last year. This includes autism teacher specialists, school psychologists and speech language pathologists, education assistants, and African Nova Scotia and Mi'kmaw student support workers. Each of these individuals will have a positive impact on students in schools across our province

Specialized training and development opportunities will also be available to teachers, so that they can build on their ability to support children who have diverse needs or behavioural

challenges, including Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). As part of the Brief Intensive Outreach Service pilot program being introduced this summer, youth under 19 years of age with ASD can also have access to specialists in Halifax and Cape Breton. Teams of specialists will work with individuals and their families by creating care plans to support young individuals who may be experiencing serious behavioural issues and developmental disabilities related to ASD.

The addition of more specialized educational workers is a positive step for our new model of inclusive education, as we continue to work in supporting the needs of all our students, so that they can flourish to the best of their abilities.



Straight teeth without conventional braces? What you need to know!

You have probably heard that there is a new alternative to conventional braces when it comes to straightening teeth! Invisalign has become a household name for magazines, tv shows and among the many adults and teens who sport them. But although many people can tell you they are familiar with the term; few people understand exactly what Invisalign is and how it works.



Invisialign is a brand name for a clear aligner product that aligns teeth. Invisalign works by having the patient wear a series of clear aligners, in sequence, that gradually guide teeth to their ideal position. Small, tooth-colored attachments are often temporarily bonded to teeth that have especially difficult movements. These discreet attachments aid the aligner in distributing forces to the teeth so that the proper movements are achieved.

Although the technology has been around since 1999, recent years have shown major advances in improving the product resulting in widespread use of Invisalign and other clear aligners as an alternative treatment modality for patients seeking to improve their smile. But buyer beware, all clear aligners are not the same. Plastic quality varies between manufacturers and discount options do not include attachments on the teeth, which limits the amount of movement that can be achieved.



Furthermore, software limitations mean an Orthodontist is best equipped to engineer your Invisalign plan to ensure your best outcome.

If at your initial consultation your Orthodontist recommends Invisalign, the next step is to obtain a 3-D virtual model of your teeth. Although traditional molds of your teeth can be made, digital scanners offer a more accurate method for capturing your bite that avoids any impressions. Before your custom-made clear aligners are manufactured, your Orthodontist must use software to manipulate your bite in virtual reality until the perfect result is achieved. This step is the most important one

as your Orthodontist's knowledge and expertise of this technology is paramount to the quality of your result.

Historically, Invisalign treatment was limited to simple crowding and minor bite issues. Orthodontists now have the opportunity to do further training on advanced Invisalign techniques, which means many challenging bite problems can now be treated with Invisalign. Many patients that have previously been told they are "not an Invisalign candidate" are now finding that they in fact are! Check with your Orthodontist as to their experience with Invisalign. How Well Will Your Kid's Brain Be Working By The End Of Summer?

or students of all ages, summer can't get here fast enough! While kids may be ready for a vacation, the opposite is true for their brain. The brain never gets tired of doing the one thing that it was designed to do: learn.

So, what happens in the summer when kids are not in school, and not providing their brains with the active intake of information that it needs to stay sharp? Like any muscle, it weakens, and it begins to forget. When students are not actively engaging their brains, neurological connections can begin to deteriorate, making it increasingly difficult to recall the information that was learned throughout the school year.

Ask your kid today how to convert a fraction into a percent and he'll tell you to divide the top number by the bottom and multiply by 100. But ask him again in July or at the

end of August and you'll likely get a blank stare.

Research shows that students can lose up to 30% of their academic skills over the summer break. This means that in the fall, students are further behind than when they left school at the beginning of summer.

Maintaining academic momentum over the summer prevents this backward learning slide, helps students remember the material they spent the school year learning, and keeps their brains in active learning mode so that they are ready to learn from the first day of school.

A few hours a week of academic work maintains important school skills. Try these tips to keep kids of all ages mentally engaged over the summer:

READ! Encourage kids to keep reading every day this summer.

Frequent reading improves comprehension skills and develops vocabulary.

TALK! Make discussing your day part of your family's regular routine. Chat about what you did, saw, or wondered about. This builds memory skills and keeps the mind active and engaged.







To reach more potential savings, the 2nd heat pump on the lower level would take the pressure of the heat loss/heat gain and provide additional savings. Manufacturer warranties

require certain conditions with regards to unit placements for such things as refrigerant line maximum length cut-offs and air flow. Be sure your contractor is aware of these standards.

9. Aim to obtain 3 physical quotes or less. Too many quotes may lead to information overload and confusion.
