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## Social Media and Children

#### Dear Parents,

was handed an article from the German broadcaster Tagesschau headlined "Australia wants social media only from 16." The article goes on to say: "Australia's government wants to legally protect young people from using social media too early. Platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok should only be accessible to people aged 16 and over. Prime Minister and labour party leader Anthony Albanese "want(s) parents to be able to say, 'Sorry, mate, but that's against the law." The proposed legislation is to be introduced into the Australian parliament later this year. After that, it could take about a year for the new regulation to come into force. .

Headlines on the same Tagesschau online page make the following claims: social media use among young people is becoming more problematic; young people are online for almost 72 hours a week; there's no minimum legal age in Germany; youth have higher self-esteem without social media; young adults are increasingly unhappy; and hate on the internet scares many people away.

#### Is any of this surprising?

Closer to home, the December 2024 issue of Maclean's Magazine features an article titled "Hold the Phone" detailing the formidable headwinds teachers and adminis-

trators face in the implementation of a much-hyped smart phone ban in Canadian schools. Frankly, it's not working where students are allowed to hold onto their phones. Most teachers think that effective bans happen only phones are pried from their eager hands with support from administration. The best that can be said is that most educators and parents agree that children under 13 should not be using smartphones in the classroom.

Platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok are available to children with the internet 24/7 unless controlled by parents and or schools. Also Chat GPT is accessible via these phones.

I recently learned a little about Chat GPT. It's a chatbot that uses artificial intelligence (AI) to understand and generate human-like text. It answers questions, writes stories and poems, translates between languages, solves math equations, and debugs and fixes code. What challenges are left for students to accomplish? No wonder teachers want to limit accessibility to ChatGPT during exercises, quizzes, tests, and exams where students' knowledge and skill are being tested.

It's even more important to remove distracting gadgetry from elementary-age children who are learning to read, write, and develop math skills. Kids want phones because the adults in their world are often glued to them. It is necessary for adults (parents and teachers) to model right behaviour with smartphones at a time when children are mastering basic skills. The use of social media by older teens and young adults is a much wider social issue that can't be fixed by schools alone as the Australian Labour Party's stance establishes.

Powerful monied interests are at work here as is discussed in a related article, "How TikTok makes billions." Problem areas include youth protection, the spread of fake news, advertising for fake branded goods, fraudulent content, and possible espionage by the Chinese state through the evaluation of user profiles.

Young minds and not so young minds are highly vulnerable. We need to protect them against a small vocal minority who cry fowl whenever teachers and school administrators show a bit of backbone.





As your MP, I'll continue advocating for investment in our riding and the people who call it home.



# Health & Wellness Are Braces in your Future?

Every parent wonders this from time to time; the only real way of knowing? Book an early screening exam by a certified Orthodontist. The Canadian and American Orthodontic Associations, recommend age 7-8 as the ideal time for this early exam but even if your child is older they will benefit from the check up.

Although the adult teeth may be just be starting to erupt, this check-up provides valuable information to your orthodontist and dentist about your child's growth patterns and jaw relationship. It also provides you, as the parent, a better understanding of the development of your child's bite. If a potential problem is identified, your Orthodontist will recommend monitoring your child at a regular interval (often yearly) until a time that treatment is indicated. Usually orthodontic treatment is recommended around age 11-12 when the main growth spurt happens and many of the permanent teeth are present, but in some cases early treatment is necessary. Early, interceptive treatment may prevent a problem from becoming more serious (possibly requiring surgery) or may achieve results that would otherwise be unattainable if treatment is delayed.

So do you know what to look for? A developing



smile can be a bit intimidating from a parent's perspective but here are some "bad bites" (or malocclusions) to watch for.

- An underbite (bottom teeth bite over top teeth)
- Crossbite (s) (top teeth bite inside bottom teeth on one or both sides)
- A deep bite (top teeth completely cover bottom teeth)
- An open bite (teeth don't come together in front)
- Protrusion ("buck teeth"),
- Excessive spacing or crowding
- Any of the following: Early or late loss of baby teeth; difficulty chewing or biting; mouth breathing; a thumb or finger sucking habit; jaws that shift or make sounds; grinding or clenching of teeth; biting the cheek or the roof of the mouth; speech difficulties or facial imbalance.

Don't be alarmed if you see one or more of these




features in your child's bite. Many changes occur as a child grows and some problems are temporary. However, calling your local Orthodontist for a screening exam is a good idea.

Now that you've looked closely at your child's teeth, what about your own? You would be surprised to learn how much you can improve the longevity of teeth by correcting the bite.

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
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# **Education Education Education Education Education** NEW BOOK LAUNCH: Failing Forward in Saarland

*■ailing Forward in Saarland* is the memoir of a transplanted Canadian with Caribbean roots, venturing with her husband and their daughter into Saarland, Germany. The memoir describes the year the family spent in this small forested land tucked away in the western corner of Germany on the border to France. Her teenage daughter made the daily commute to attend a lycée in France and her husband spent most days doing research in labs and forests. What was the mother and wife left to do in the Saarland with next to no knowledge of the German language let alone the Frankish accent? As a career teacher, the author's life had never before been reduced to awaiting the daily home-coming of a daughter and husband. During her year in Saarland, she did much more than that. This book is an entertaining and informative account by an experienced Black teacher of what it means to transplant a family into a foreign country and how to enjoy a welcoming culture.

Most significantly, this memoir is a meaningful addition to the literary corpus focusing on strangers in a strange land. Even though the author is







intimately familiar with the notion — she has lived most of her adult life in Canada, far from her Barbados birthplace — she immediately faces the challenges of adjusting to the customs of a new land and, especially, learning to communicate in German. And her story is anything but ordinary — it's a moving, often amusing, and sometimes humbling account of the author's adventures and learning experiences in a largely unknown country without the benefit of fluency in the local language. As the title indicates, the author comes to view these challenges — and even failures — as positive "life lessons in adaptability, strength, and resilience" — failing forward.
